In this special, the features people of color who are living with HIV, including Dorian Klemensine, Jose Ramos, Dale Roberson, Marilynn Ramos, Ceaser Corona, and Daniel Garza. In addition, Jerry Rodriguez, Christian Ramirez, and Miguel Bujanda (three individuals who have been close to those with HIV) give poignant testimonies on camera.
